There are many ways in which you can help ensure that the library will be around for many years.

Library Endowment Fund

The Library Commission established the Endowment Fund in 2007. Several donations and the proceeds from the library's first Scholastic Book Fair provided the seed money for the Endowment. The goal in establishing the Endowment is to provide permanent support for the purchase of extraordinary materials and services that the library would otherwise be unable to afford.

All gifts to the Endowment are used to build the fund's principal. The interest earned on the investments will be used for special library materials and services.

The library welcomes gifts in any amount to the Endowment Fund. Gifts may also be made in a variety of forms (i.e., cash, check, bequests, etc.). Most gifts to the Endowment are tax-deductible.

Honorary or Memorial Book Donations

Do you need a gift for the person who has everything? Would you like to honor a friend or loved one in some special way? Consider adding a book to the library in honor or memory of a special individual.

Adding a book to the library is a thoughtful and enduring way of paying tribute to an individual. (We've even added books in memory of a special pet!) A bookplate is inserted in the book listing both the donor and honorees names. We will also add your names and the item donated to a *Gifts and Memorials Log* that is kept on display in the library. A letter of acknowledgement is sent to the donor and the individual (or family of the individual) being honored.

Let us know what subject area or section of the collection you are interested in supporting and how much you would like to donate. Typically, books for the youth area cost \$15-\$25 and books for the adult area range in price from \$20-\$40.

Remember, gifts to public libraries are tax deductible!!

The Friends group usually meets on the fourth Wednesday of each month from September through May at 7:00 pm. Meetings are opened to everyone and refreshments are served after the meeting.



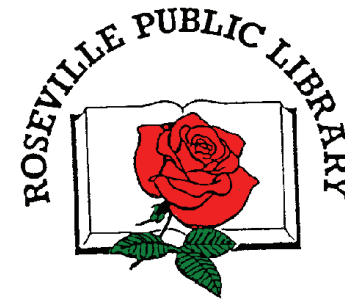
Sponsor a Program
